The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) notes that "Molds produce allergens (substances that can cause allergic reactions), irritants, and in some cases, potentially toxic substances (mycotoxins). Allergic reactions to mold are common."

The Institute of Medicine (IOM) found there was "sufficient evidence to link indoor exposure to mold with upper respiratory tract symptoms, cough, and wheeze in otherwise healthy people. Other recent studies have suggested a potential link of early mold exposure to development of asthma in children."

In other words, living in a mold-infected home will make you feel like you have a cold year-round. <u>If you have children</u>, the dangers are MUCH worse.

Of course, that's the most common kind of mold. The generally "harmless" kind.

There are rarer cases that you would *swear* came straight out of a horror film.

The scariest thing is, <u>you won't know</u> what the possible symptoms are until you know what kind of mold you have.

It could be harmless...

So yes, be worried.

If you own your own home, you'll want to pay VERY close attention to what I say next.
